

## 2.1 Water

How to provide a dependable supply of high quality water in a way that maintains healthy aquatic environments and uses water efficiently.

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Government and Public work together to reduce water usage.

#### **Priorities:**

##### A) Government Leadership

Strategies:

1. Town owned building should have low flow fixtures or have a plan to have them put in place in the near future.
2. Plan to review existing water meters.

##### B) Have incentives / Restrictions

Strategies:

1. Have incentives of approximately 10% off cost of rain barrel.
2. Have incentives of approximately 10% off cost for low flow fixtures.
3. Have an over-usage charge for excessive water usage.

##### 6) Public Education and Willingness

Strategies:

1. Use public electronic bulletin boards to put the amount of water used on a monthly basis.
2. Use visuals to show examples of usage and how they reduce their water consumption and put them in the multi media avenues the Town of Sundre has.
3. Seminars with professionals to educate people of all ages on how to conserve water.

### **Medium Term (2-5 years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Future Budget Allocations and grey water reclamation for car washes.

#### **Priorities:**

##### A) Money Allocated to the water system for sustainable projects.

Strategies:

1. In budget, more money allocation to the water department for sustainable projects.

##### B) Grey Water Use of Car Washes

Strategies:

1. Research on how local car washes can use grey water and/or recycle systems.
2. Research possible incentives for local washes to use grey water and/or recycle systems.

## **Long Term (10+ years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

The Town of Sundre have dual water mains per street.

### **Priorities:**

A) Bylaw for new developments to have dual water mains per street.

Strategies:

1. Dual water mains in every new development (one for treated water and one for untreated water )
2. Replacing existing water mains with dual mains within the Town.
3. Place dual mains east side of Town.

B) Water on the East Side

Strategies:

1. Water on the East Side

## 2.2 Recreational & Leisure

How recreational and leisure activities for residents and visitors will be delivered to exceed expectations while protecting the environment.

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Recreation and Leisure become a community priority.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Educate citizens on the existing facilities and advertise events happening at those facilities.

Strategies:

1. Have an events board outside of each facility with current events. (Sign must be highly visible).
2. Advertise the facilities on available multi media.
3. Links for the different facilities and events more visible on all appropriate websites.
4. Add facility and minor sports contacts to the Welcome Package.

B) Positive personnel to make facilities a success.

Strategies:

1. Ongoing training for existing personnel on facilities and the communities they serve.
2. Community input survey on recreational facilities (how they did that year, how to improve, what went well etc.).

7) Government Leadership

Strategies:

1. County participation.
2. Municipal reserves allocated for recreational and leisure use.
3. Educate Council on recreational and leisure opportunities.

D) Community Involvement

Strategies:

1. Volunteer recruitment.
2. Parenting Classes.
3. Adopt-A-Park Program

Strategies:

1. Regular maintenance is required and done by local contractors using sustainable practices.

2. Design and build skateboard park.

Strategies:

1. Regular maintenance is required and done by local contractors using sustainable practices.

## 2.3 Energy

How to meet your community's energy needs in an efficient, affordable, sustainable, and reliant way, while managing greenhouse gas emissions and air quality.

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Through education and government leadership sustainable energy is created.

#### **Priorities:**

##### A) Education

Strategies:

1. Use of multi media avenues to educate the public on energy efficiency.
2. Seminars on reducing energy consumption.
3. Target school ages children to be energy efficient.

##### B) Government Leadership

Strategies:

1. Appropriate Municipal Government planning.
2. Incentives to go energy efficient.
3. All newly purchased Town buildings / vehicles are energy efficient.

##### A) Research

Strategies:

1. Research innovative initiatives to lower energy emissions for the Town of Sundre.
2. Research alternative sources of energy for long term use (ex: micro wind turbines, solar, ethanol etc.)

### **Medium Term (2-5 years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Reduce energy emissions through innovative initiatives.

#### **Priorities:**

##### A) Implement Research

Strategies:

3. Implement innovative initiatives to lower energy emissions for the Town of Sundre.
4. Alternative sources of energy for long term use (ex: micro wind turbines, solar, ethanol etc.)

##### B) Government Leadership

Strategies:

1. Lobby Federal Government for use of incentives to encourage use of alternative energy sources.

## 2.4 Arts, Culture & Heritage

How arts, culture and heritage will be supported, enhanced and delivered and how they will stimulate and support the transition to sustainability in our community.

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Sundre & Community encourages it's unique Arts, Culture & Heritage.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Promotion & Advertising of events, activities and programs.

Strategies:

1. Newsletters, flyers, websites, paper ads, TV channels, Olds radio stations, electronic board downtown, website links to Town website, school announcements, murals and emails.
2. An organized group of artisans in Sundre to assist with event planning and promotions of local artisans.

B) Support from Sundre Town Council and Community for “Sundre Days” (trade show of community groups) and “Music in the Park”.

Strategies:

1. Town Council has a vested interest as they belong to and support the community.

### **Medium Term ( 2-5 years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

To make more funds available to promote the arts, culture & heritage in Sundre.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Funding of Sundre's Art, culture and heritage sponsorship.

Strategies:

1. Involve Community & Citizens (Volunteerism, building relationships, funding for building/revamping facilities such as parks, community gardens, trails, and recreation.)

### **Long Term (10+ years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

To promote and encourage life long learning among the Sundre Community.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Education

1. Art Gallery, More Clubs (ex: Big Brothers and Sisters), walking tours, community gardens, education in schools (more about Sundre), Youth & Seniors working together.

## 2.5 Food

How to ensure healthy, nutritious and sustainable food supply that maximizes opportunities to build the social, ecological, culture, and economic capital of the community.

### **Short Term (0-24months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Locally produced food is available to local citizens.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Farmers Market

Give support in any way to the appropriate Health Region to ensure that the Town of Sundre and area has a new Health Complex.

Reserve land for a new Health Complex.

B) Assisted living program

Strategies:

1. Seniors are self-sufficient.

C) Long term care Facility

Strategies:

1. Initiate the long term care facility project.

1. Planning of parallel access roads.
2. Planning for new bridges (Red Deer River, Bearberry Creek and Prairie Creek).

### **Long Term (10+ years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Implementation of transportation plans.

## **Priorities:**

### A) Government Leadership

#### Strategies:

1. Parallel Access Roads.
2. Bridges.

## 2.9 Materials and Solid Waste

How to meet your community's need for material supply and disposal through the most efficient use and re-use of the most sustainable materials and keeping waste out of the natural environment.

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Reuse products/materials.

#### **Priorities:**

A) Education and promotion of reducing as a key to minimizing waste.

Strategies:

1. Promote more care in purchasing
2. Encourage minimum use of plastic grocery bags.
3. Encourage grocery stores to offer more items in bulk.
4. Offer recycling options in grocery store parking lots.

B) Service stations offer bulk oil

#### **Priorities:**

## 2.10 Communication

How to ensure that residents and visitor have easy access to opportunities for the interchange of information, thoughts and opinions.

#### **Priorities:**

3. Use of scrolling bulletin board at traffic light. (Board to be put in place by Rodeo & Race Association)
4. Use of Sundre High School's Video Conference Centre (VCC). See details of this in the Learning strategy area (section 3.12)
5. Community skills/expertise inventory.
6. Use of F.M. Transmitter Radio to communicate local events and activities.

### **Medium Term (2-5 years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Create meeting spaces, new opportunities and awareness of our local assets.

#### **Priorities:**

- A) Creating meeting spaces/opportunities.

Strategies:

1. Create a vibrant town centre on the model of many European cities – more for people than for cars.

- B) Take advantage of skill in the community – set up an exchange mechanism.

Strategies:

1. Web based – easy access of community skills inventory.

- C) Use of various electronic media to facilitate learning, awareness and information exchange within the community.

Strategies:

1. Enhanced Sundre website; interactive, available, inexpensive and conveniently accessed.

  1. Flexibility in the uses of the downtown area & encouraging residential occupancy.

**Long Term (10+ years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Providing housing options and accessible facilities for all ages and economic groups while keeping our small town feel.

**Priorities:**

- A) Sustainability information is readily available.  
Strategies:
  1. Permanent displays and information (bill boards/demonstration homes)
  
- B) Community residents are aware of grants and incentives available from all levels of government regarding sustainability and affordable housing.  
Strategies:
  1. Ongoing information gathering and sharing.
  
- C) All new housing is at platinum “Built Green” standard  
Strategies:
  1. There is a local “Built Green” assessment process available for all builders.
  
- D) Downtown residential density is increased by 10% per year.  
Strategies:
  1. Encouraging commercial and residential development of downtown.
  
- E) Community encourages photovoltaic arrays and local bio-fuel facilities.  
Strategies:
  1. Providing locations suitable for large scale energy facilities.
  
- F) No waste from construction sites.  
Strategies:
  1. Unbearable costs to dump construction waste.

Strategies:

1. Set up communications systems for a directory and gather information.

1. Review needs and current programs.

### **Medium Term (2-5 years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Broaden and enrich the educational experience of students.

#### **Priorities:**

## 2.15 Built Environment

### **Short Term (0-24 months) Preferred Future Initiative:**

Strategies:

1. Continuously monitoring core planning documents and changes made as necessary.
2. Research & advertise sustainability grants and incentives for the public.
3. Negotiations between Town of Sundre and Mountain View County for developable land.
4. Enforcement of sustainable policies/bylaws.
5. Work with commercial building owners to help with costs for deep services to all infrastructure in Sundre.

### **Long Term (10+ years) Preferred Future Initiative:**

The Town of Sundre leads the community in all future sustainable development.

#### **Priorities:**

##### A) Government leadership.

Strategies:

1. Through continuous monitoring of all core plans Sundre has a small town feel & unique design that reflects sustainability.
2. Researching and implementation of sustainable principles for all of Sundre's land base.
3. Through negotiations between Town of Sundre and Mountain View County producing

farmland will be priority when deep services are put in place.
