

# **Our History**

The Sundre Municipal Library was established in 1949, and was first housed at the Women's Institute Hall. Library volunteers took a three-day course which qualified them to serve as librarians. In its early years the Library was open only one day per week, and closed for July and August.

Seventy-two years later, things have changed! The library is housed in spacious quarters in the Sundre Community Centre, with a bright children's area, an expanded adult section, and public computer stations. It is open year round.

Our Library currently employs one full-time Library Manager and three part-time Library Assistants.

We are fortunate to have an established Friends of the Sundre Municipal Library Society who aid the library in fund-raising.

#### **Our Plan of Service**

Public libraries in Alberta are required to develop a Plan of Service every 3 years. This document serves as a 'road guide' to assist library staff in collection development and program planning during the course of the plan. Library Boards review their Plan of Service regularly to ensure alignment with Service Goals.

In preparing our new Plan of Service, the Library Board used the information contained in a recent community needs assessment prepared by Greenwood Neighbourhood Place to consider areas which could be addressed through library services.

# **Service Responses:**

# 1. Nurture Young Learners through Early Literacy

Children under 5 will have programs and services designed to equip them with skills necessary to begin a successful educational journey.



# 2. Be an Informed Citizen: Local, National and World Affairs

Residents will have access to information to assist them to make informed decisions in fulfilling their civic responsibilities at the local, provincial and national levels.



The woods are lovely, dark and deep. But I have promises to keep, and miles to go before I sleep.

Officially known as the Snakes Head Natural Area but customarily referred to as Snake Hill, it is a provincial natural area managed by the Town of Sundre. You're unlikely to encounter one of the few garter snakes that inhabit it but deer and moose are not uncommon. Large predators are also around but stay away when there's human activity present - at least we hope that continues to be the case.

The trails on Snake Hill were originally opened by the Biathlon Club and additional development took place for the Alberta Winter Games sometime in the 1980s. The cross country ski trails are maintained by Town staff during the summer while the Bike'n Ski Club develops and maintains single track trails for mountain biking. During the winter, the Club grooms the trails for cross country skiing and fat biking.

In a bit of a twist from our traditional CX venue, we bring you Snakes and Ladders. Snake Hill in Sundre has been home to may events in the past, but none like cyclocross. And we say, why not? In our double header weekend we hope to satisfy your desire for traditional CX racing along with stuff we can't put in the tech guide and day two shenanigans with the possibility of getting you home for Sunday dinner with your non-racing family.
