BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

On January 30, the unit that is required to grind the inorganics in our waste stream failed. Upon inspection of the unit it was discovered that it cannot be repaired.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES:

The grinder has had minimal maintenance, however in the past 38 years, has had modifications to electrical and motor systems. This unit is similar to the lift station in that damage can be caused by the presence of H²S. Additionally, due to future and current capacity requirements, the system needs complete replacement. Engineering has received quotes on a larger replacement grinder system similar to the existing unit. We have also received quotes for and a new design that screens and augers out inorganics. The the new screen system (option A) is quoted at \$482,345.80, while the replacement grinder (option B) is quoted at \$161,642.76. Delivery for the grinder is 4-6 weeks. The delivery of the screen system is 2-3 months.



BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Well #5 has experienced sudden pumping failure. The pump specialist has removed the 80-footlong system. The pump and the piping connections require replacement.

Well 4 has been maintained and is the large main volume pump. It is currently keeping up with the demands.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES:

Well 5 will requires a new pump and re install immediately. The new system will take 4 to 8 weeks to build and install. The estimate for this replacement to get #5 back online is approximately \$50,000 for the pump plus approximately \$15,000.00 for the install.

Operations recommends approval of the refurbishing and associated removal and install costs of \$65,000.00 for Well 5.

Relief for COVID 19

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

The COVID 19 Pandemic has placed financial strain on businesses and individuals through the restrictions imposed to slow the spread of the virus.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES:

A number of measures are being unrolled by the federal and provincial governments, however, there may still be a period of time where residents are unable to make their utility payments to the Town on time. Many municipalities are offering temporary relief by way of deferring utility payments for a 90-day period, with no penalties, for those affected by COVID 19.

It is important to note that a deferral of utilities does <u>not</u> mean that the payment is forgiven or waived; it means that the payment is not due for a specified period of time, in this case, for the months of April, May and June. It is also critical to identify that the deferral is only for those businesses and residents who have been affected financially by the pandemic.

The Town would encourage those choosing to participate in the deferral program to continue to pay an amount within their means to mitigate the future impact of the deferred amounts.

A full discussion on deferring tax payments with be forthcoming. The Town is expecting information from the Province with regard to School requisitions shortly, and administration will be bringing a recommendation forward with regard to tax deferrals pending confirmation. In the meantime, if participants in the monthly Tax Installment Payment Program (TIPP) could put their payments "on hold" until June 30th, the system would automatically recalculate a revised monthly payment amount based on any unpaid installments plus the 2020 tax levy spread across the remaining six months.
